Financial Help for Families

#### Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund (CSEF)

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school incursions excursions, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible to receive CSEF.

The 2026 annual CSEF amount per student will be \$ 400 for Primary and Secondary students.
